Shiocton School District 2015 - 2016 District Goals

Realize a graduation rate of 100% for full-academic-year (FAY) members of the Class of 2016.

By the end of the 2015-2016 school year, 90% of FAY students in **Grades K-6** will meet their targeted growth in the area of Reading as measured by Fountas & Pinnell Benchmarks and/or STAR.

Teachers in **Grades 7 & 8** will implement district approved curriculum in the areas of math and reading with fidelity. This will be monitored through 4 observations in each content area throughout the 2015-16 school year as well as attendance at professional development in these areas.

90% of **Grade 9 - 12** teachers will incorporate writing into classroom activities (13 times during the 2015-16 school year) using the school-approved writing rubric to score those activities

Continue progression of technology into instruction and curriculum:

- offer 16 Tech Tuesday/Wired Wednesday professional development sessions to foster technology
- host two staff development learning sessions that foster technology integration including on-line assessment options and expanding the use of Google, Edmodo, or other platform for on-line assignments
- provide focused professional development to foster the use of on-line, web-based curricula and instructional lessons

Offer or participate in at least two Community Outreach Events:

- Shiocton/Bovina Fire & EMS parade
- At least two board meetings off-site in district townships
- Offer open weight room and hallways to community
- Offer wellness information to community as provided by Bellin (nutritious meals, concussions 101, etc)
- Offer "keeping your child safe in social media" or related informational event
