## **CHIEF CHATTER**

#### **MOVING COMPANY is MOVING IN**

Make way for a new "business" in town, the Moving Company. New to Shiocton Elementary School, the Moving Company gives students a purposeful mental and physical break with a bit of heavy work.

Students arrive to class at different levels of alertness. Some students are sleepy and yawning, appearing uninterested, while others arrive "ready and raring to go" with enough energy to run a marathon; still others arrive somewhere in between those spectrum ends. Regardless of which level of alertness the child exemplifies, the fact remains that the child is not at all ready to sit, listen, and perform.

One sure fire means of addressing these student needs is heavy work or what is scientifically referred to as 'proprioceptive input'. Proprioception is a form of input to the muscles and joints, a wakeup call to the nervous system. When heavy work is done, the brain and body are stimulated, energy is expended, and the child is more ready to purposefully focus on learning.

The Moving Company transforms this theory into application as students meet at the loading dock to pack a few books into a backpack and move them to the wagon station. There, the student unpacks the books and loads them into the wagon, then moves the wagon back to the original loading dock. During the moving process, the student and adults are engaged in conversation, building a relationship and setting the stage for a return to class, a return to focusing, and a return to learning.

A huge **thank you** to Mrs. Kern, Mrs. Butch, and Mrs. Thiel for bringing the Moving Company to Shiocton Elementary School.

while third grades shared their persuasive writings. This is a great way for students to learn from a peer, while getting ideas and feedback from other writers not usually in their classroom.










## Grade 5
