Welcome to the 2023-2024 school year! I hope you are in the midst of a wonderful summer! One of the first things we have to do before school begins is to have all families go through the registration process. With that in mind, I would like to share important information with you for the beginning of the year. For students in grades 1-12, school begins on Monday, August 28. For students in Early Childhood, Four-Year-Old Kindergarten, and Five-Year-Old Kindergarten, please refer to the box below for the appropriate start date.

PK-6 Information for the 2023-2024 School Year



<u>Arrival to School</u>: Buses begin unloading, one bus at a time, at 7:40 a.m. (*7:35 a.m. for those eating breakfast). Students who walk or get dropped off at school should not arrive before 7:40 a.m. We



ask for your cooperation with this since supervisors are not on duty until this time and teachers are making final preparations for the day within their classrooms. If the crossing guard is not yet outside by the elementary doorway that means it is too early to arrive at school. We ask that you do not drop your child off until the crossing guard is in place. *Please note that Broad Street becomes a one-way street in the morning during drop-off and at the end of the school day, therefore, please go the opposite direction of the school buses during these times.

Elementary students will then enter through the elementary entrance and be assisted by staff members who will help them get to their hallway locations and/or classrooms. (*For K4/K5, teachers will meet the students outside and the classes will come into the school as a group.) Middle school students will be dropped off by the district main entrance and will wait in the lobby area until they are dismissed to class at 7:50 a.m. (*Watch for grade level signs in the lobby for where to stand.)

the end of the day.



Attendance: The school day begins at 7:57 for all grade levels. Students are required to attend school on a regular basis and to arrive on time each day. Parents/Guardians are responsible for their child's attendance and need to ensure their child, in grades K5-12, does not miss more than 10 days of school. Parents/Guardians are asked to call the school office at 986-3351 (ext. 721) before 8:00 a.m. to report an absence. Feel free to leave a voicemail message. For further information on attendance policies and procedures, please see the student handbook. Student attendance will be closely monitored by the nurse, principal, counselor, police-school liaison officer, and other school personnel.



Class Assignments & Schedules: Registration is taking place August 8-9. Once that is done, we will

make sure our classrooms are balanced and will then finalize our class lists. Families will be able to find out their child's teacher no later than August 16 by looking within Skyward Family Access. Sixth grade students will receive their schedules at the Open House during the sixth grade meeting. (See the "Open House" information below.) Skyward schedules are tricky for sixth graders to read and understand, therefore, the teachers will touch on this at the Open House and again on the first day of school.

Free & Reduced Hot Lunch/Breakfast Program: If you believe you may be eligible for the free lunch/breakfast program or the reduced lunch/breakfast program, please complete and return the application form to Mrs. Danke before school begins (even if you are not sure as to whether or not you qualify). All applications are confidential and are reviewed in accordance with state guidelines for the Free and Reduced Lunch/Breakfast program. Until the applications have been approved, students must pay regular prices. Therefore, please submit your application form as soon as possible. If you need an application form or have any questions about completing the form, please contact Mrs. Deb Danke at 920-986-3351 ext. 816.

<u>Medication:</u> Please remember that students are <u>not</u> permitted to bring medication to school. <u>Medication must be brought to the school nurse by a parent/guardian</u>. If you have any questions, please contact the school nurse, Mrs. Kayla Duenas, at 986-3351 ext. 714.

Open House: Families have the opportunity to come in and drop off supplies in the appropriate classrooms prior to the first day of school. The Open House will take place on Wednesday, August 23, from 4:30-6:00 p.m., followed by a Welcome Back Social from 6:00-7:30 p.m. outside in the back of the school (weather permitting).



Elementary Open House – 4:30-6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, August 23 *Come in, drop off materials & supplies, & see your new classroom.

<u>Middle School Open House</u> – 4:30-6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, August 23 *Come in, drop off materials/supplies and receive your locker information.

*For Grade 6 – There will be a meeting at 5:30 p.m. on this day in the cafeteria.

<u>Please mark your calendars now and plan on attending the Open House on August 23!</u> <u>We look forward to seeing you there!</u>

<u>Picture Day:</u> Picture Day is scheduled for <u>Wednesday, September 13</u>. Picture retake day is scheduled for Tuesday, October 17.



<u>School Bus:</u> All students are expected to behave appropriately and safely while on the school bus. Even if your child is not a daily bus rider, your child will likely ride the bus at some point (field trip, sporting event, etc.). Here are the bus rules that you can discuss with your child/children:



Use quiet voices.
Use kind words.

Report unsafe activity to the driver. Follow all directions from the driver. No eating or drinking on the bus Stay in your seat.
Pick up litter that you see.
Face forward at all times.
Keep hands, feet, and objects to yourself.

<u>School Expectations</u>: We work very hard to reinforce the following expectations with students in PK-6 on a daily basis:

These expectations are posted within the classrooms and are included in the daily announcements. Please discuss these expectations with your child at home prior to him/her coming to school. Teachers will take time at the beginning of the year to help the students understand what each of these expectations means.

Shiocton Partners in Children's Education (SPICE): SPICE is the school's Parent/Teacher Organization (PTO). This committee of volunteers meets on a monthly basis to plan special events and activities for the students and families within the Shiocton School District. Parents, community members, and staff members are always welcome to attend! SPICE is always looking for more people to become involved in



order to continue to operate and do all of the wonderful things that they do. Meetings are typically held on the first Wednesday of the month in the LMC; however, the first meeting of the year will be held at 6:30 p.m. on August 9 at the River Rail. Please come and join us!

Student Dress: Parents are encouraged to see that students are dressed in a manner which is appropriate for school. The attitudes of students are often affected by the way they are dressed. Jackets, coats, hats, headbands, etc., are not allowed in school, as well as clothing that is excessively torn or full of holes. Clothing promoting alcohol,




tobacco, or drugs is not permitted. Clothing containing inappropriate designs or words, suggestive, sexual, or gang related references is not to be worn in school. The school reserves the right to send students home if their appearance does not reflect good taste, cleanliness, or is disruptive to the educational process. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated with this on a daily basis!



Student Handbook & Chromebook Handbook Information: Shiocton student handbook information for Grades PK-12 is available on the district's website. In addition, students in Grades 2-12 will utilize Chromebooks; therefore, it is important to view this handbook as well. Both handbooks should be viewed during the online registration process. These handbooks can also be found on the district's website under the "Student" tab. Please take time, prior to the beginning of the school year, to familiarize yourself with both of these handbooks and to discuss the information with your child/children.

Student Planners: All students in grades 3-6 will receive a student planner (agenda) at the beginning

of the year. Elementary students are to record their assignments in their planners on a daily basis. The planners will serve as a major communication tool between home and school. Both teachers and parents/guardians will have opportunities to write messages in the planners on a daily and/or weekly basis. As students get older, we hope the use of the student planners in elementary school will have helped each individual with their overall organization and that the use of the planner becomes a habit. We believe the planners not only promote and enhance organizational skills, but also promote and enhance home/school communication. If a student loses his/her planner, he/she will need to purchase another one for \$5.00 in the PK-6 school office.
