### Board Approves Hoffman for CM, Architectural Services


On Monday, May 15, the Board of Education approved the recommendation from the Building Project Committee to hire Hoffman Planning, Design, and Construction, Inc to provide both the Construction Management (CM) and the Architectural services.

Two evenings earlier in May were set aside for presentations and interviews with three firms who had submitted bids for CM services. "All three firms presented solid credentials, articulating how they could meet the anticipated needs of possible remodeling and construction projects," noted Mrs. Schweitzer, District Administrator. "It was not an easy decision, and in the end, the Building Projects Committee chose to recommend Hoffman because of their demonstrated experience working on school-based builds of this size. Too, the Committee felt that Hoffman would have the shortest learning curve and be able to move a bit quicker in this tight timeline given their knowledge of the needs through the facility study that they conducted for the District." In keeping, the Committee chose to recommend Hoffman as the provider of architectural services.

Now that the Board has approved both a CM and an architectural firm, the Building Project Committee is able to roll up their sleeves, sharpen their pencils, and dig in to the details of the many infrastructure and space needs articulated in the facility study from this fall. The Committee will meet with representatives from Hoffman on May 31 to review the various projects that were prioritized in earlier meetings this spring, as well as to review the timeline to referendum. Mrs. Schweitzer forecasts that community meetings to gather ideas and share thoughts will be held closer to August, once some of the preliminary work such as costs and draft designs have been fine tuned.

A new regime is under way in Shiocton, as [Track and Field](#) Head Coach Jon Schwantz looks to draw upon his coaching experience to help lead the charge. With 32 years of coaching experience under his feet, Coach Schwantz feels his experience will be beneficial to the track and field program. "It's not me, it's the coaching staff." Coach Schwantz capitalized on his long standing relationships with proven performers to strengthen the overall coaching by bringing former UW-Platteville [All-American](#) discus thrower, Alex Walechka, and Jared Sanchez, hurdles coach for UW-Oshkosh, on-board. He rounded out the coaching staff with Kaden Piechoki, SHS alum, to continue working with the high jump athletes, and Mr. Mike Isbel to continue his work with the distance runners. "It's a really great coaching staff. A plethora of skilled coaches. Just being a head coach of 32 years, I understand what it takes to be organized".

After 32 years of coaching at Omro, including 30 years coaching wrestling and [six](#) coaching cross country, the resume just doesn't stop. Added to his impressive coaching background is his ability to literally drive the bus. Coach Schwantz is a licensed bus driver and is used to driving his teams to their sporting events.  **Notes from the Nurse**

Students **entering K5** will need to have a series of vaccines to be compliant with immunization law. Students **entering 7<sup>th</sup> grade\*** will need to receive a Tdap vaccine. Please provide the school with a copy of any new immunizations your child has received.

ciation. "I was involved with it for ten years: District rep for eight years.

All the connections, all the state coaches; the more people you know, the better resources". So, why was Shiocton the choice? Coach Schwantz says he took a year off once he retired, only to realize he missed coaching. "I wanted to be an assistant coach. When the AD called and needed a head coach, I guess I just said, sure, why not just do it. Seniors need and deserve to have a coach who knows how to manage everything. It takes a lot".

Coach Schwantz knows what kind of culture he's looking to build in Shiocton. "Have fun, work hard, and be committed". When asked about his boys and girls X-factors, Coach Schwantz knows he has stars on his team, including Cade Stingle - a Minnesota State football signee - and Jacob Klitzke - a St. Norbert Track and Field signee. "We have some really good seniors, Cade and Jacob are having great seasons. Expectation for Jacob is to be throwing shot and disc". Regarding X-factors for the girls' team, Coach Schwantz noted Kendall Stingle a NDSU Track and Field signee, as well as Karissa Birch. "Kendall of course and Karissa, who just broke the school record on the 100. I'm hoping Ari (Stingle) can finish her high school (track and field career) on a positive note". Diamonds in the rough include Paxton (Kuehn Bechard), who Coach feels has a lot of potential for a freshman, as does Lydia Hofacker.

Regarding his expectations this season, Coach Schwantz noted, "Work hard, take care of the things you have control over, compete at a high level every meet, and be in the top third of the conference meet." Coach expects that both teams will be in the conversation of one of the top teams in the state tournament, fighting for a state championship. With talent across the board, the Chiefs are ready to get off to a running start.

Not only was Coach Horn extremely proud of Lexi, but of the team as a whole. When asked to describe the season with one word, the answer, Coach Horn responded, "Growth." She noted that many of the female wrestlers had little experience in the sport but developed throughout the season to end the year very strong. Lexi believes that she and her grappling mat-mates helped inspire younger girls, giving them something to look forward to and someone to look up to. "Shiocton is creating a legacy by having two female coaches for their girls' team", noted Coach Horn on the legacy the Shiocton wrestling program is building.

Be on the watch for the 2023-24 season as Lexi Riehl seeks a return to Madison while Coach Horn continues to build the girls wrestling program in hopes that more female wrestlers can emerge victorious next year.

## State FBLA: Competition, Learning

Last month, four Shiocton High School students earned qualified for the WI State FBLA competition in Green Bay, . Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA), is a club at Shiocton where high school students build leadership and presentation skills, while showcasing their knowledge in a variety of areas related to Business Education.

So, why did these students decide to do FBLA? President Ashlyn Van Camp, senior and recipient of the Who's Who recognition, noted, "My first year, I felt like I had leadership and was really good with public speaking, so thought it would be good for me. I do it every year now because I genuinely get something out of it". State-qualifier Jordyn Houterman, senior, chose to join because she "wanted to try something new" noting that she wasn't sure exactly what she wanted to do but had heard others talk positively about FBLA and decided to give it a look. Fellow state-qualifier, Davin Piechocki, senior, decided to join in order to "meet new people and advance my business skills". Members appear to have a similar goal in mind: to broaden their horizons while growing their skills in business and communication.

Jordyn Houterman and Davin Piechocki, along with senior Bennett Wilcox, and sophomore Tyler Pamperin, participated in the WI State FBLA competition this past month. FBLA advisor, Mrs. Jessica Miller, noted that State FLBA is an excellent leadership conference. "Students have to qualify to compete at State by being a top

placer at one of seven regional conference meets." Mrs. Miller noted there are a wide variety of competitive events, including those that require the completion of an objective test or responding to 100 questions in six minutes, as well as other events where students present completed projects, participate in role plays, and give speeches.

Davin and Bennett competed in the Computer Game and Simulation programming competition and earned eighth place overall in the final round. Tyler, who took first place at regionals, competed in Introduction to Business Communications earning seventh place overall. Jordyn qualified for [Organizational Leadership](#), [taking second](#) place.

In addition to competing for the top spot, state-qualifiers can also partake of skill building offerings including key notes speakers and workshops, as well as tours. State took place in Green Bay this year. Jessica Miller on how hard it is to qualify. "It depends on the events, some are full, others there are only a couple participants, so you just automatically can qualify".

Even if you don't qualify for the state competition, there is still plenty to do at State. "There's networking, branching out, and meeting more people. I've been to so many now, I recognize people there every year", said Ashlyn. "There's a bunch of workshops, you can do three or four a day, and you can always meet new people. If you didn't make it you can still go and learn stuff. The different academy changes every year. They still have something

for people who didn't qualify," said Jordyn. Ashlyn Kortens, who didn't qualify, still attended a leadership conference, which afforded her additional training and the opportunity to meet other FLBA students.

Every one of the FBLA members has gotten something out of it. "One, you get to be in a group with a huge variety of interests. No matter what career you want to go in, it's a business. It's actually a lot deeper than a school club. You can get business leader knowledge no, talk to people you don't see or talk to everyday. Good to have the skills and knowledge of leadership. Looks good on scholarship", said Ashlyn. Jordyn "A good learning experience. It looks good on college applications. Not a lot of work, fun to learn about stuff, just speaking and a few tests. I liked being part of an organization."

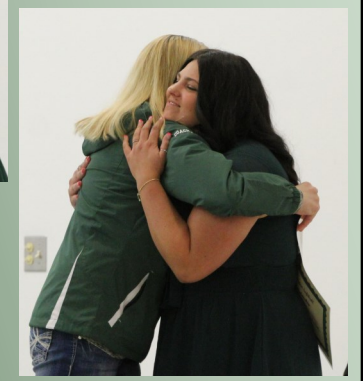

The Wellness Committee finished another successful year by providing opportunities for staff to participate in games and exercise to promote healthy lifestyles.

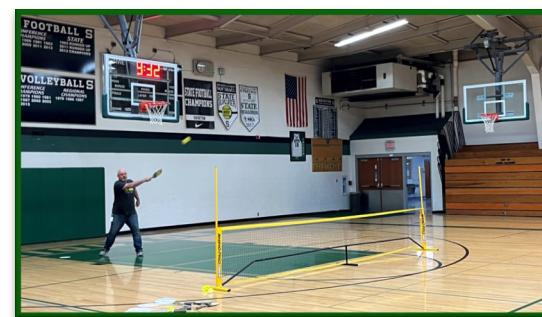
