





Noetic Math Contest

On November 11, 123 students in Grades 3-6 participated in the 2022 Fall Noetic Math Contest. There are twenty problem solving questions on the test with varying degrees of difficulty. The students had 45 minutes to complete the test. Each question is worth five points. The highest percentage reached by a student in Shiocton Elementary so far has been 90%. STEP 2: Complete & Upload Health Information

Once you have registered for Viewpoint Screening and have ordered your background check, you will need to upload required health information into the Health Portal. The Health Portal contains detailed information and forms needed to complete the below requirements:

- Complete TB Testing—Requires 4 Visits
- Annual Influenza Vaccine (Required if class dates are from 11/1 through 3/31. Clinical sites have the right to require annual influenza vaccination past this timeframe
- COVID-19 Vaccination
- COVID-19 Booster (if eligible)

Note: Some of these tests and immunizations require more than one visit. It may take up to 6 weeks to complete the health work needed to go to clinical, so starting those as soon as possible is recommended. Proof of documentation is required for all health work and can come from: Wisconsin Immunization Registry OR official documentation that includes your demographic information and dates of vaccines from your health care provider. 
