# Weight Training Tip of the Week

#### How Much Protein Do You Need?

Some people recommend 40-70 grams of protein a day, some say only 30, but the truth is you need to calculate how much you take in. The amount you need is determined by using your body weight and how much you lift. To find the grams of protein to take, take you body weight and divide it by 2.2, then multiple that by 1.5 to find the daily amount of protein in grams. So for me, I would take 285lbs (Yeah I'm a big boy), divide by 2.2 (about 130), then multiply by 1.5, to find that I need to consume relatively 200 grams of protein a day. There are also variations of amounts for those who lift harder or don't lift very often. If you lift a lot, then instead of multiplying by 1.5, you'd use 2.4, and if you don't lift frequently, you should multiply by .86 instead. But how is the best way to obtain this amount? Well, according to a recent study by Muscle and Fitness, Whey Protein is the best supplement for body builders, it ranked higher than Creatine! But you also have to consider all the food you eat in a day, because if you just take straight up protein shakes for protein, it may have a reverse affect on your body. So calculate the amount you need and start lifting...


