Griesbach Completes MS TEALS Experience

Microsoft The (Technology Education and Learning Support) program is a Microsoft philanthropy program designed to help build sustainable high school CS (Computer Science) programs. The program requires two years of inclassroom experience, which Shiocton High School teacher, Mr. Harley Griesbach, completed this year. Mr. Griesbach takes us through the learning process through the program and what TEALS is about.

"It's Microsoft's approach to increasing the number of people pursuing career related fields related to the computer science field", said Mr. Griesbach on what TEALS is really about. In order to be a part of the TEALS program, one must first apply to work with Microsoft. Once you are a part of the TEALS program, Microsoft will have professionals come in to work with students. "They provide a support curriculum. They have coteachers who come in and work with the students, showing them how stuff happens in the real world. Students get experience, understand logic and math, while gaining transferable skills in those careers," said Mr. Griesbach on what the learning environment is like with working through TEALS. "Industry professionals come in and talk.

TEALS Last week, we talked about how math is critical in life." When asked how working with the TEALS program provides a better learning experience, Mr. Griesbach responded with, "It validates everything we are doing, what happens in the real world. The classes that are offered through the TEALS program are Intro to Computer Science and AP Computer Science Principles. "It's a different way to teach while doing it with co-teachers. It's very different."

Busy in First Grade

Here in first grade, we have been enjoying the first signs of spring with the warm days



we have been having. We have been able to do some science learning outside exploring with our shadows and day and night patterns! In the next few


months, we'll be exploring various opinions as we read and write about them. Just a reminder to please keep up that nightly routine of reading with your child. It's one of the most important stepping stones to a successful school year. Also remember to check SeeSaw for important messages and work that has been added to your child's journal.

In math this last quarter, we'll be concentrating on the following units: time, fractions, 2D and 3D shapes, measurement, and solving addition and subtraction facts where there is an unknown partner (13+_ = 18). Here are a few ideas to help your child connect math to the real world: Time—Telling time to the hour and half hour on both analog and digital clocks.

Fractions—when making/cutting sandwiches or fruit, etc. ask your child to cut the food in half or fourths. Give your child 8 slices of an apple. Ask him/her to divide the slices in half (2 groups), or give you a fourth of the slices (2 slices). Shapes—play "I Spy" with common objects around the room. For example, say "I spy a circle" (clock), "I spy a cylinder" (can of soup), "I spy a rectangular prism" (shoe box). Unknown Partner Equations—present everyday type problems: when shopping, tell your child you need 9 cans of soup, but you already have 4 cans at home, so how many should you buy right now? When cutting fruit, tell your child you had 10 slices of an apple, but now there are only 3, so how many did I eat? By involving your child in these everyday type situations, he/she will see how important math

is in our lives and how we use it in the real world.

Good luck to the Shiocton spring sports teams. We hope the seniors have a great last season and the teams accomplish many great things.




Battle of the Books

School-Age Children Need Their Rest

Establish a regular bedtime and stick to it. Setting a regular bedtime and wake up time reinforces a child's biological clock, making it easier to fall asleep quickly and wake feeling fully rested and

Eliminate distractions in your child's room. If there's a television or computer in the bedroom, establish another place where kids can use them.

Avoid feeding your child a big meal too close to bedtime. A heavy meal close to bedtime can keep a child awake at night.

Build in quiet time before bedtime. Because the days are still long, children may want to go outside to play after dinner. Make sure they come back inside in enough time to allow some time to relax before bedtime.

Establish a relaxing bedtime routine. Is it a bath in the evening, followed by a book? Or the reverse? Try different routines: find out what works best, and stick to it.

Maintain a comfortable room tem**perature.** Be sure the bedroom isn't too hot or too cold, and that pajamas are comfortable and seasonal.
