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Shiocton High School Hall of Fame Taking Nominations

Dom Gunderson, Athletic Director, is pleased to announce the inception of the Shiocton High School Hall of Fame. Gunderson, a 2014 SHS Alum, spearheaded the Hall of Fame effort as a means of maintaining the rich heritage and tradition of the successful athletic programs at Shiocton High School. The Hall of Fame will serve as a means of recognizing, preserving, and honoring the athletes, teams, coaches, and individuals who made significant contributions to these athletic programs throughout the school's history.

Criteria for nomination and selection of the induction class

In order to maintain the integrity of the Hall of Fame, nominees must exemplify the highest standards of sportsmanship, ethical conduct, and moral character. All candidates will be judged on their significant and/or long-term contributions to Shiocton High School athletics. In addition, as much as possible, acknowledged leadership in his/her chosen field or community, state, and national presence will be considered.

Candidates may be nominated as a player, a coach, or contributor by anyone with ties to the Shiocton Community. Candidates may not nominate themselves.

For the 2023-2024 inaugural year, the nomination forms will be due by March 15, 2024. The nomination form is available on the Athletics webpage on the District's website; a paper application can be picked up or requested through the Athletic Director's office or the Shiocton High School office. Athletes selected will be invited to be recognized at the end-of-year banquet, which is planned for June 2024.

Referendum: Two Questions Posed to Voters

Community members for the nine municipalities that comprise the School District of Shiocton will have an opportunity to cast their vote on the two referendum questions listed on the sample ballot provided on Page 2.

What is the impact on my taxes?

The mill rate is projected to be consistent at \$10.32 per year for the next three years.

If both questions are approved by the voters, taxes will increase in the 2024-2025 school year by \$1.97/\$1000 of home value or \$197.00 on a \$100,000 house. However, given the projection of a static mill rate, voters would not see an increase in their taxes in the 2025-2026 nor the 2026 - 2027 school years. [It is important to note that the District does not determine when reassessments happen; that is the decision of each municipality.]

What is the duration of the two referenda?

The Operational Referendum is for three years beginning with the 2024-2025 school year. Given the amount of the Capital (Building) Referendum, the District plans to make three draws over the same three years (EX: \$12 million, \$12 million, and \$11.8 million). Each draw has a payback period of 20 years.

Child Development Days

What is Child Development Days?

Who is Eligible to Participate?

- Children who are ages 3-4 not enrolled in 4K.
- Children who have not previously participated in Child Development Days.
- Children to reside in the School District of Shiocton.

When is Child Development Days?

What Happens at Child Development Days?

Your child will be screened in a relaxed and friendly setting in the areas of Communication, Personal-Social, Motor and Academic Readiness. When the screening process is completed, a school professional will share the results with parents and address any concerns. The entire screening process is completed within approximately 1 hour.

FOUR-AND-FIVE YEAR OLD KINDERGARTEN ENROLLMENT FOR 2024-2025 SCHOOL YEAR

The Shiocton School District will be holding four and five-year-old kindergarten enrollment the week of **February 19—23, 2024** between 7:30AM and 3:30PM. For four-year-old kindergarten, enrollment packets will be mailed home in mid-February to the parents/guardians whose children are eligible for the program. For five-year-old kindergarten, enrollment packets will be given to all students currently enrolled in the four-year-old program. Parents/guardians are asked to contact the elementary office at (920) 986-3351 ext. 721 to request an enrollment packet if they do not receive one or if their child is not currently enrolled in our four-year-old program.

The forms within the packets are to be filled out and dropped off in the elementary office between the hours of 7:30AM and 3:30PM during the enrollment week. Enrollment will only take a few minutes. Parents of 4K students are asked to bring their child’s birth certificate on that date. It is not necessary for the child to be present.

Parents/guardians will finish the remainder of the full registration process online in August with all of the other grade levels.

Four-Year-Old Kindergarten: The four-year-old program is an optional program; students spend one year in this program before moving on to Kindergarten. Registration is open to all children in the district who will be four years old on or before September 1, 2024. Students in the program meet for four full days (Mon-Thurs) each week.

Five-Year-Old Kindergarten: To be eligible for this program, a child must be five years old on or before September 1, 2024. Students in this program meet for five full days each week.

Orientation: An orientation will be offered in the spring. Watch for more details in the near future.

With the middle school Shiocton boys basketball season coming to a close, both seventh and eighth grade teams impressed coaches Ben Taylor and Ben Prodehl during their season while only being able to practice one day per week. The seventh grade boys, coached by Mr. Taylor, finished the year with a 7-5 record, while the eighth grade boys, coached by Mr. Prodehl, finished with a record of 8-4.

Coach Taylor was very impressed with his seventh grade team this year with balanced scoring and everybody playing their role very well.



“There’s been multiple games where everyone scores. We played good defense with a good team effort.” In three of their five losses, the seventh graders lost by one possession, with three players in their class playing on the eighth grade team. “[This year was] very good and successful; they battled and fought. If they had their three best players they wouldn’t have lost a game.”

With the eighth grade team finishing 8-4, Coach Prodehl listed Brent Collar as one of the biggest impact players. His body, size, footwork, and the physical presence he brings helps him impose his will on opposing players. Coach Prodehl also listed the seventh graders who stepped up giving effort in every game. He credited that effort shown by the whole team for their success. “We were in every game. There wasn’t really a game where we didn’t have a chance at winning.” On what went well this year, Coach Prodehl mentioned the instant impact from the “young guys”. “It’s a big jump from seventh to eighth grade. A lot of teams are bigger and stronger than us, but we competed with them. I just want guys to compete and play at the highest level to get better”.

Make sure to watch for the eighth graders making a jump to high school basketball next year, and the new seventh and eighth grade teams next season.

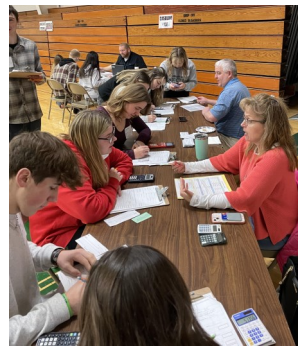
Seniors are Successful in Reality Check

Shiocton seniors were recently faced with the challenges of *Reality Check*, a financial literacy simulation designed to allow students to explore the realities of personal finances in the real world.

More than 20 volunteers from Shiocton and the surrounding area shared their expertise to make the event happen. In November, the seniors participated in mock interviews with professionals in their chosen career field. Students created application materials and honed their interviewing skills prior to this event. They applied those skills masterfully, and some students even walked away with job offers.

On Friday, January 5, 2024 *Reality Check* was held. Seniors received a monthly income based on their chosen career and a life status that included a child. At stations operated by community volunteers, the seniors discovered how far their monthly paycheck would go. They paid for health insurance, vehicles, mortgages, food, daycare, even personal items and pets. Most were surprised at the price of daycare and health insurance and some were frustrated when unforeseen expenses happened—just like in real life. Several had to make difficult financial decisions and sometimes had to seek part-time employment. They definitely received a dose of reality but had a little fun in the process.

The Shiocton seniors and their teacher, Ms. Schneider, would like to thank all of the volunteers for donating their time and talents. Congratulations to the seniors on successfully completing their interviews and this simulation!

Shiocton Students Take Trip to Eagle River

For the eighteenth time in the last twenty years, Shiocton students were able to participate in a weekend trip to Eagle River and learn more about the outdoors. From December 6-9, 2023 nine students and two chaperones, (high school teachers Mr. Schwaller and Mrs. Miller) went to Trees for Tomorrow Natural Resource Specialty School in Eagle River. “The primary focus of the workshop was forestry and managing land for different purposes,” said Mr. Schwaller. Students also learned about basal area, tree identification and measurement, logging operations, and much more. “There is a good balance of education and entertainment,” added Kira Schwaller, a student who participated in the trip.

Each person who went on the trip all share their favorite part in common; everyone enjoyed just being outside. With only around one-third of the learning experience in the classroom, much of the learning comes from outside on the 40 acres of the property. “I enjoy getting to be outside and experience the outdoor spaces they have in Eagle River,” added Kira Schwaller. “I’ve made lots of good memories there and will never regret choosing to go.”

Trees for Tomorrow also offers an exclusive experience for students to get out of the classroom and learn something that isn’t taught at Shiocton. “It’s not something that’s taught in the classroom, it’s important for students to go out and do stuff,” added Mrs. Miller on the out of classroom experience. “We don’t offer an environmental education course here, it’s a completely different learning experience for students,” said Mr. Schwaller.

When asked if the trip to Trees for Tomorrow was beneficial, Mr. Schwaller replied,



“absolutely.” “The opportunity to learn new skills and be able to take students out and work with natural resources. It’s an opportunity to hear about different career options. Overall, a major benefit to all involved.” Kira Schwaller also added, “I think this trip is very beneficial for people. Even if science is not your favorite subject, the

topics they cover are very interesting and I think it can be good to learn in environments outside of school as well.”

Trees for Tomorrow also provides a very fun experience to all who participate. “Just because this trip is meant to be educational, does not mean that it is boring. Out of all the school trips I’ve been on this is definitely one of the most fun ones,” included Kira. If you’re somebody who isn’t sure on whether or not to go, Mr. Schwaller’s advice is to just do it. “If you’re not sure about going and doing it, just go. It’s immersive, you’re busy the whole time, and you get a chance to step out of your comfort zone. If you’re interested in the outdoors or don’t know what to do post high school, it’s a fun, free, and new experience. Get a group of people and do something different.”

If you’re someone who is interested in going next year, the dates are already set and you’ll have the opportunity to participate next school year.

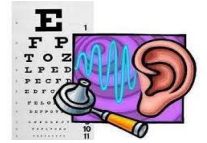


