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Shiocton Schools Celebrate Recycling Efforts, Enjoys Learning Garden

Does recycling really pay off? Absolutely. Just ask Ms. Schmidt and her second grade students joined in on a ribbon cutting ceremony to celebrate winning the grand prize as a result of the school's recycling efforts.

Sponsored by corporate donors Brita, Meijer, and Terracycle, the 2021 Brita and Meijer Recycled Learning Garden contest kicked off on March 15, 2021 throughout schools in Illinois, Michigan, Indiana, Ohio, Kentucky, and Wisconsin. Schools who were already participating in any of the TerraCycle recycling programs were eligible to enter the contest. Schools from the six states then competed against each other to log the most votes by July 15, 2021.

Ms. Schmidt and students throughout the Shiocton Elementary grades began a strong campaign to get the word out and to get the votes in. Their efforts were successful and the school



was recognized as the sole awardee out of the six states on July 20, 2021. In accepting the award, Ms. Schmidt noted that the "Recycled Learning Garden program has provided our district and community the opportunity to support eliminating waste. We are coming together to recycle with Terracycle, as well as educate our youth on items that can and cannot be recycled."

On Wednesday, May 18, representatives from Brita, Meijer, and Terracycle joined Ms. Schmidt and her students formally celebrate winning the contest with a ribbon cutting ceremony. Caroline Martin, Retail Senior Business Development Manager for Terracycle, stated, "Even though Shiocton is a small community, it is the perfect example of how every single action makes a difference for our planet." Olivia Hart, Areas Sales Manager for Brita, concurred, noting that Brita's efforts are to "ensure all have healthy drinking water and our recycling efforts help to give back to those who do not have the cleanest, healthy water". Derek Sanderson, General Manager of Meijer in Appleton, noted that Meijer is a Midwest family company. "We appreciate people shopping at our stores and recycling, which is part of our corporate values."

The contest's grand prize was a learning garden bundle. The bundle consisted of three recycled garden beds, two picnic tables, three benches that students can use to admire their growing garden, and a convenient trash receptacle to help keep the garden clean.

"Students have already begun to enjoy the picnic tables during lunch time and children have enjoyed sitting on the benches under the trees," noted Mrs. Schweitzer, District Administrator. "Ms. Schmidt is to be congratulated in her efforts to bring awareness and effort to recycling, and certainly for her efforts to lead us in winning the grand prize. These items will be enjoyed for years to come."

The district has plans to landscape around the two flower beds that flank the 9-1-1 commemorative rock out front of the main entrance to the building. As well, the district hopes to write a grant and/or raise funds for a cement pad under the tree that the benches can be permanently set on by the elementary entrance.
