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Out with the Old, In with the New

Main Playground Structure Purchased

After more than 25 years of play, the current playground structure has served its purpose. Over the last year, we planned and began fundraising for a new play structure, surfacing, benches, and other accessories for the outdoor play area. With all the research and consideration, we brought the design options to student representatives, recess supervisors, and staff to get their feedback on the play structure. The top choice overall will offer the students many options to spread out, climb, and slide, as well as have ADA capabilities to allow students with all abilities to use the play structure.

On September 4, 2024 the School Board of Education approved the purchase of a new playground structure through Northland Recreation. We will use a portion of the funds that were already raised through community donations, SPICE fundraising, and approved grants just shy of \$30,0000 with the remaining funds provided by the school budget that was designated for such projects. We anticipate the new structure to be installed by this November.

Allowing school to be proactive in an emergency



During staff in-service week, a group of staff members attended training on substance abuse and the use of Narcan. Narcan is an emergency medication used to rapidly reverse a drug overdose. Our district was honored to receive the donation of two Overdose Aid Kits from Start Healing Now. One kit is located by the district office doors, and the other is located on the football field concession stand. Our goal is to bring harm reduction supplies to our youth, staff, and parents. We want to create a recovery friendly environment and be proactive in the event of an emergency.



Gov. Evers, WisDOT Announce Launch of Wisconsin's New Driver Education Grant Program

Gov. Tony Evers, together with the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT), recently announced the launch of Wisconsin's new Driver Education



Grant Program. The program, funded by the 2023-25 biennial budget signed into law by Gov. Evers, aims to reduce barriers for low-income students to take driver education courses and become licensed drivers, while promoting safe driving and safer roads. Wisconsin Act 86 (2023) creates a driver education grant program to pay the costs of driver education courses for certain low-income eligible students at approved driver education providers. The last quarter of the 2021-2022 school year saw a stark decline in the number of COVID-19 positive cases among students and staff in the School District of Shiocton. This experience continued through the 2022 - 2023 and the 2023 - 2024 school years despite the existence of variants such as Omicrom, JN.1, and, most recently, KP.3.1.1.

Shift towards endemic status

The status of COVID-19 remains that of an endemic. An endemic disease is considered to be a disease that is still around but that is occurring at a level that is not causing significant disruption in our daily lives.

Influenza is a commonly known virus considered to be an endemic. It is an illness for which there are vaccinations and treatment options. It is also one that can see a spike in positive cases at times, which can shift its status to that of an epidemic. When this happens, businesses and schools typically look to a longer weekend for closure and ramp up sanitation efforts for a period of time to ensure the virus is not living on surfaces nor in the air such that it could be contracted.

Given these factors, the School District of Shiocton will treat COVID -19 potive cases as it does all other endemic positive cases.

General Operations:

- Ill children stay home from school until 24 hours fever free without the use of a fever -reducing agent.
 - Parents are responsible to monitor their child(ren) each morning: do <u>not</u> send ill children to school
 - Parents will be encouraged to have their child tested for COVID if symptoms displayed are common symptoms of the virus
 - Contact the school nurse (x714) if you have concerns or questions about your child's symptoms
- Provide District Administrator continued decision-making ability regarding the institution of additional mitigation strategies in the case of school transmissions

Guidance and References:

- Continue to monitor District data regarding illness, positive cases, and related statistics
- Continue to monitor data and guidance provided by Outagamie County Public Health
- Continue to monitor research and guidance provided by the Center for Disease Control (CDC), the Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS), and the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI)
