### **Building Project Committee: Needs Still Exist Board Approves Hoffman as GC**

At their meeting on August 13, the Building Project Committee discussed the building-related needs that remain despite the outcome of the Capital Referendum last February.

The Committee reviewed the feedback from the community that was provided through the on-line and paper-based survey, as well as the comments shared through the survey and at the in-person meetings. According to the feedback, the three projects garnering a majority of “most important” votes included Infrastructure and Maintenance, Safe and Secure Entrances, and Technical Education Wing. The playground also garnered its fair share of the “most important” votes ahead of the gymnasium, lockerrooms, fine arts wing, and child care wing.

Replacing and expanding outdated and deteriorating infrastructure was key item of discussion. Ryan Micke, Director of Building and Grounds, also indicated a heightened level of concern regarding the playground structure, noting that one of the slides is no longer repairable and will again need to be blocked off from use. He also discussed the deteriorating condition of many of the joints and necks, sharing concerns that it is difficult, sometimes impossible, to purchase these parts given the age of the structure. As the playground structure is integral to student learning, both from a standpoint of social skills development and as a source of physical exercise, the need to provide a stable and safe structure with activities accessible by

all ages is a need that must be addressed.

Discussion also centered on the need for updated Tech Ed facilities and the utilities that instruction in these areas rely upon such as HVAC and electric. Discussion regarding the need for space for the child care center included consideration of remodeling our current spaces. Doing so could eliminate building a wing while still providing a dedicated area in the school building such that all child care rooms could be in one area of the school building and more readily accessed by parents. The need for expanded gymnasium space, ADA compliant seating, and equitable locker-room provisions was also discussed, as was the need for a dedicated learning area for the vocal and instrumental fine arts programs with appropriate acoustics and practice room space.

#### **General Contractor**

On a recommendation from the Building Project Committee, the Board of Education approved continuation of General Contractor services from Hoffman Planning, Design, and Construction, LLC. Hoffman will continue to support efforts related to a future Capital Referendum, which, if approved by the Board, would go before voters in April 2025. Hoffman confirmed that the company will not engage in any self-performance of any of the divisions of work should the Board choose to move forward with a building referendum in Spring.

The Building Project Committee is scheduled to meet again on Monday, September 16, 2024 beginning at 6:00PM.

### Where is Child Development Days?


The Child Development Days screening are held at Shiocton Elementary School located at N5650 Broad Street, Shiocton, WI 54170.

### What Happens at Child Development Days?

Your child will be screened in a relaxed and friendly setting in the areas of Communication, Personal-Social, Motor and Academic Readiness. When the screening process is completed, a school professional will share the results with parents and address any concerns. The entire screening process is completed within approximately 1 hour.

### How can I register for child Development Days?

## SCHOOL DISTRICT OF SHIOCTON ANNUAL NOTICE OF SPECIAL EDUCATION REFERRAL AND EVALUATION PROCEDURES

Upon request, the School District of Shiocton is required to evaluate a child for eligibility for special education services. A request for evaluation is known as a referral. When the district receives a referral, the district will appoint an Individualized Education Program (IEP) team to determine if the child has a disability, and if the child needs special education services. The district locates, identifies, and evaluates all children with disabilities who are enrolled by their parents in private (including religious) schools, elementary schools and secondary schools located in the school district.

A physician, nurse, psychologist, social worker, or administrator of a social agency who reasonably believes a child brought to him or her for services is a child with a disability has a legal duty to refer the child, including a homeless child, to the school district in which the child resides. Before referring the child, the person making the referral must inform the child's parent that the referral will be made.

Others, including parents, who reasonably believe a child is a child with a disability may also refer the child, including a homeless child, to the school district in which the child resides.

Referrals must be in writing and include the reason why the person believes the child is a child with a disability. A referral may be made by contacting: Kelly Thiel, Director of Special Education, at 920-986-3351 ext. 773, or by writing at N5650 Broad Street, PO Box 68, Shiocton, WI 54170.
