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Greenlight Grant Initiative: Staff, Training

At the Community Connection meetings held in August, many attendees asked if the District would be applying for the Greenlight Grant Initiative funds. Promoted widely by Matthew McConaughy, the Greenlights Grant Initiative focuses on the grants included in the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act.

Though the grant programs do not provide funds directly for the construction of new buildings and secured entrances, such as that which is included in our Priority Projects, the Greenlight Grant Initiative grant programs are designed to bolster school security, improve wellness and mental health services in schools, and create a healthier learning environment by way of providing financial resources for :

- technological solutions (apps, hotlines, and other forms of anonymous reporting)
- training for staff (that improves school climate and provides staff with other strategies to prevent school violence and support students with mental health concerns)
- Hire additional staff (mental health professionals, climate specialists, school psychologists, school social workers, school-based violence interrupters, and others directly supporting the prevention of school violence)

Building Project Committee reviews community feedback, may add project

Feedback received during the Community Connection meetings in early August was shared with the Building Project Committee members on August 30.

“Overall, there appears to be a strong understanding that the prioritized projects are needed.” commented District Administrator, Nichole Schweitzer, referring to the 94.2% of attendees that indicated they would support the referendum with the five prioritized projects .

Following a review of the feedback shared through the exit survey and the notations about how the projects could be improved, the Building Project Committee members and Hoffman looked to make a few changes, including the potential addition of the elementary plumbing to the Infrastructure project.

Mrs. Schweitzer also asked committee members to consider adding in the replacement of the current

playground noting that the new structures are much more costly than what had originally been forecast. Initial estimates range from \$350,000 to \$480,000 but Schweitzer noted that District Administrative Assistant, Rachel Krueger, was continuing to explore additional options with the current vendor, as well as other vendors. Given the adjustment to the costly of the Fine Arts wing, it is anticipated that both of these additional items could be added without exceed the initial range of \$30-\$35 million range.

The Committee will meet again on September 13 to finalize their recommendation of projects to the Board of Education.

This is the 7th-12th Grade Principal, Mr. Ortlieb. I am excited to be able to get some information out to all of you as we start the 2023-2024 school year. Everyone in the Middle School/High School Office is looking forward to a positive start to the coming school year. A big thanks has to go out to our wonderful IT and Maintenance staff for all of the work that they have done to get the school ready for our students to return.

Welcome back to another school year!

When students bring home school library books, please help them take care of their books by encouraging them to find a special place at home to store their books when they are not being read. Reading with clean hands is another great way to keep library books clean.

For students in 5K through 5th grade, that will be each week on their regularly scheduled library day. Through all the new enrollment and excitement, we have been fortunate to retain all of our staff. We are looking forward to a fun-filled school year!




Staff Development:

ANNUAL NOTICE OF SPECIAL EDUCATION
REFERRAL AND EVALUATION PROCEDURES**

Upon request, the School District of Shiocton is required to evaluate a child for eligibility for special education services. A request for evaluation is known as a referral. When the district receives a referral, the district will appoint an Individualized Education Program (IEP) team to determine if the child has a disability, and if the child needs special education services. The district locates, identifies, and evaluated all children with disabilities who are enrolled by their parents in private (including religious) schools, elementary schools and secondary schools located in the school district.

A physician, nurse, psychologist, social worker, or administrator of a social agency who reasonably believes a child brought to him or her for services is a child with a disability has a legal duty to refer the child, including a homeless child, to the school district in which the child resides. Before referring the child, the person making the referral must inform the child's parent that the referral will be made.

Other, including parents, who reasonably believe a child is a child with a disability may also refer a child, including a homeless child, to the school district in which the child resides.

Referrals must be in writing and include the reason why the person believes the child is a child with a disability. A referral may be made by contacting: Mrs. Kelly Thiel; Director of Special Education, at (920) 986-3351 ext 773, or by writing at N5650 Broad Street, PO Box 68, Shiocton, WI 54170

GEARING UP FOR KINDERGARTEN

A Home-School-Community Summer Partnership for a Strong Start



With the support of former Green Bay Packer Mark Tauscher's TRIFECTA Grant, Shiocton's elementary teachers, public librarians, and parents of this fall's

kindergarteners developed a partnership to strengthen early literacy skills across the summer.

Shiocton Elementary School was awarded \$3,000 by former Green Bay Packer Mark Tauscher's TRIFECTA Grant to purchase books that would be given to Fall 2023 kindergarteners. The grant's goal is to build up each child's home library full of high-quality, engaging texts geared at de-

veloping vocabulary and pre-phonics skills. Shiocton's 4K and 5K teachers, speech and language pathologists, and literacy coaches procured more than 100 titles. They are housed at the Shiocton Public Library.

Parents began the summer with a backpack full of books funded by the School District of Shiocton. These books are for them to keep in their home library. Across the summer, parents are encouraged to visit the library weekly. Librarians greet them with a backpack full of library books that meet the criteria established by Shiocton educators. With each visit, children get to select a book (for keeps) from Mark Tauscher's TRIFECTA bookshelves.

Throughout the summer, Shiocton Elementary's homepage listed a set of pre-phonics, vocabulary, and writing activities for parents and soon-to-be kindergarteners to play across the week. "Parents appreciate the suggestions," shares Kathy Schmitt.

"They find the activity suggestions helpful and easy to follow."

"The parents really love coming in and picking up a backpack full of the right kind of books. They don't have to spend a lengthy amount of time searching for those titles," says Shiocton Public Library assistant, Kim DeWindt.

"Our goal is for children to read 100 books this summer," shares Kathy Schmitt, Shiocton Elementary Reading Specialist. "The majority of those books are checked out from the public library. Parents participating in the program across the summer will have built up a home library of at least 20 books."
