#### 5710 - STUDENT COMPLAINTS

The Board ~~of Education~~ recognizes that, as citizens, students have the right to request redress of complaints. Further, the Board believes that the inculcation of respect for lawful procedures is an important part of the educational process. Accordingly, individual and group complaints should be provided for and appropriate appeal procedures implemented. **Multiple policies provide complaint procedures available to students which include but may not be limited to:**

- 2. Policy 2260.01- Section 504/ADA Prohibition Against Discrimination Based on Disability;

- 3. Policy 2260 - Nondiscrimination and Access to Equal Educational Opportunity;

- 5. Policy 9130 - Public Requests, Suggestions, or Complaints.

If a student has a complaint which does not appear to fit any of the above categories or another adopted policy of the Board, the student should present the complaint to the student's Principal or the District Administrator for review and response.

~~For purposes of this policy, a student complaint shall be any such that arises out of actions, procedures, and policies of this Board or its employees or the lack of such policy or procedure.~~

~~The Board or its employees will hear the complaints of the students of this District provided that such complaints are made according to procedures established by the District Administrator.~~
