Program Regulations:

- **Registration** The summer school registration window is **April 21-30**. Fees must be paid at the time of registration in order for students to be officially registered in each class. Students will be scheduled into classes on a first come, first served basis. Please contact the school office at 920-986-3351 ext. 721 if you have any questions or need any assistance with registering for summer school classes.
- **Eligibility** All students from districts within the Fox Valley Summer School Consortium are eligible to attend classes. The Consortium school districts include Appleton, Brillion, Freedom, Hilbert, Hortonville, Kaukauna, Kimberly, Little Chute, Menasha, Neenah, and Shiocton.
- Credit Recovery and/or Credit Bearing Summer School Classes in Other Districts: Any parent wishing
 to enroll a student for a credit recovery and/or a credit bearing summer school class that is OUTSIDE
 of their home school district should complete the registration form and turn in to the SCHOOL THEIR
 STUDENT PRESENTLY ATTENDS.
- Attendance Students are expected to attend summer school on a regular basis. Please contact the
 <u>PK-6/Summer School Office at 920-986-3351 ext. 721 to report an absence</u>. Absences jeopardize
 earning credit for high school classes. If attending high school classes in another district, please note
 the summer school attendance policy for that particular district.
- Conduct Regular school year rules apply during summer school. Remember to *Be Safe; Be Respectful; Be Responsible . . . Be the Best That You Can Be!* Students are expected to go home when their classes end. If students attend only one or two classes, they will not be allowed to wait a long time for rides or to hang around in the school due to there being no supervision during this time.

Program Fees:

• There are no overall program fees for summer school unless your child enrolls in a class that has a fee for supplies and materials. For classes with fees, the fee amount is listed within the class information. Fees must be paid at the time of registration in order for your child to be officially registered into classes.

Individual Student Course Schedules:

• Student schedules will be distributed the week before summer school begins for students currently in grades K4-8. You may also print out your child's finalized schedule during that first week of June.

Canceled Classes:

Courses may have to be canceled due to insufficient numbers or lack of staff. For this reason, we ask
that students select their first and second choices for each hour. By doing so, this will prevent the
office staff from having to make individual phone calls home to obtain the information. Thank you, in
advance, for your assistance with this!

Pupil Transportation:

• Student transportation to and from summer school is the parent/legal guardian's responsibility. No transportation is provided by the school district for summer school.

Grade Level:

The grade level listed for each class refers to the grade that a student will be entering in the <u>FALL</u>.

Classes Designed to Give Your Child an Extra Boost in Reading or Math (while being fun at the same time):

Course: Reading Adventures Grade Levels 1-4

Time: 9:00-10:00 Section 1 (Grades 1-4) 10:00-11:00 Section 2 (Grades 1-4)

Description: Come join us as we enter the world of reading. We will take a magic carpet ride and set our

course for an hour of make-believe and fantasy. And if that is not your cup of tea, try a summer camping trip, or searching for clues in a scavenger hunt. This is a great opportunity to enhance

your love of reading while exploring your imagination.

Course: Ravenous Readers! Grade Levels 1-4

Time: 8:00-9:00 Section 1 (Grades 1-4)

Description: Let's get lost in a book! Come join us as we dive into the wonderful world of books! We will be

studying different genres anywhere from mysteries, graphic novels, fiction, to biographies, to

informational, etc.

Course: Math Refresher Grade Levels 1-8

Time: 10:00-11:00 Section 1 (Grades 1-2) 11:00-12:00 Section 2 (Grades 5-8)

Description: This is the class for your child if he/she needs a boost in math OR the perfect class if you would like

your child to continue using his/her math brain during the month of June. This class will afford your child with opportunities to continue to work on math skills after the school year has ended and is

meant to maintain and extend what your child learned during the school year.

Course: Freckle Math/Reading Grade Levels 2-8

Description: Are you a student who would like to polish up your reading and/or math skills or extend your

learning in reading or math, but be able to work independently? If so, this is the perfect class for you. Come participate in this class where a teacher will oversee a computerized program that begins by assessing your skills. Once the assessment is complete, a program will be designed to meet your needs. You will spend each day working at your own pace with the intent of enhancing and strengthening your skills through a computerized format where you can earn coins and work to new virtual levels similar to that of a video game. *If your child will not be able to attend summer school, but you would still like him/her to boost his/her math or reading skills, then sign up for Section 3 or Section 4. This will allow your child to join in the class from the comforts of your home, the

babysitter's home, etc.

Course: Hottest Titles in Town Grade Levels 6-8

Time: 8:00-9:00 Section 1 (Grades 6-8)

Students are not allowed to participate in other summer school classes until the "red folder" work has been completed and the summer school teacher has signed off on the red folder work.

Course: <u>High School Health</u> (.5 credit)

Time: 9:00-10:00 Section 1 (High School)

Description: This class is for high school students who would like to earn credit for Health during the summer

months. Students will have face-to-face class meeting times as well as online coursework which will need to be done independently. This class will run June through August and will be offered on a first come, first served basis. Priority will be given to students who have scheduling conflicts within
