# School District of Shiocton Summer School 2020

#### Special Information for August 2020:

- Class size is limited to 10 students per class due to the COVID-19 situation.
   Therefore, classes are likely to fill up quickly.
- If your child is ill, keep him/her home.
  - If your child is exhibiting symptoms (see below) commonly associated with the coronavirus, please keep him/her home and contact your physician.
- Students are strongly encouraged to wear masks, but are not required.
  - NOTE: a staff member may ask students to mask due to the closer proximity of the learning activity and/or there may be a specific situation that necessitates such. In such an event, communication regarding will be sent home.
- Students will use hand sanitizer at the beginning of class, during if needed, and again at the end of each class.
- Students will not be able to congregate in any area of the building.
- We will do our best to practice social distancing during summer school, and we ask you to do the same during pick-up and drop-off outside of the building.
- When picking up your child, please wait outside and practice social distancing from others. We will bring your child outside, one class at a time. We will hold signs indicating which class is coming out.
  - Please be aware of the name of your child's last class, since this will make it easy to locate your child.
- We are very thankful to the Shiocton teachers who were able to teach classes in August. We could not have offered classes without their participation!
- The administrative team will continue to monitor the COVID-19 situation in our area. Changes to the summer school program will be made as necessary.

### Symptoms commonly associated with COVID-19:

- Temperature, fever of 100.4 or more OR chills
- Coughing OR shortness of breath
- Fatique or muscle/body aches
- New loss of taste or smell

- Headaches
- Nausea, vomiting, and/or diarrhea

#### **Program Information:**

- Registration Registration for summer school can be done online between
  July 14-24. Students will be scheduled into classes on a first come, first
  served basis. Fees must be paid at the time of registration in order for
  students to be officially registered in each class. Please call and leave a
  message at 920-986-3351 ext. 713 if you have any questions or need any
  assistance with registering for summer school classes.
- Grade Level The grade level listed for each class refers to the grade that a student will be entering in the FALL.
- Attendance This year, since summer school is an eleven day option, we hope that students will be able to attend each day, but understand if there are conflicts. If your child is ill, please keep him/her home AND contact the PK-6/Summer School Office at 920-986-3351 ext. 721 and note the symptoms since this is something we will need to keep track of each day.
- Conduct Regular school year rules apply during summer school.

  Remember to \*Be Safe; Be Respectful; Be Responsible . . . Be the Best That You Can Be!\* Students are expected to go home when their classes end.
- Program Fees There are no overall program fees for summer school
  unless your child enrolls in a class that has a fee for supplies and materials.
  For classes with fees, the fee amount is listed within the class information.
  Fees must be paid at the time of registration in order for your child to be
  officially registered into classes.
- <u>Individual Student Course Schedules</u> You will be able to access and print your child's schedule once you register him/her for classes. We will also have a hard copy of the schedule available on the first day for those who are unable to print from home.
- **Schedule changes** Since there are only eleven days of summer school, we will not allow switching of classes once summer school begins.
- <u>Pupil Transportation</u> Student transportation to and from summer school is the parent/legal guardian's responsibility. No transportation is provided by the school district for summer school.

# **Drop-Off Procedures for Summer School:**

- For those in Grades K5 and 1 who will be attending "Camp Fun for Kindergartners & First Graders" - Students should be dropped off by the Shiocton Elementary School entrance where staff will meet your child at 8:00AM.
- All Other Students should be dropped off by the District Main Entrance ("Where Excellence Is Expected") just prior to 8:00AM.

- Staff will meet students by the doorway and will get them to their locations.
- Please remember all social distancing guidelines during this time.
- Please remember that we do not have crossing guards for summer school.

#### Pick-Up Procedures for Summer School:

- For those in Grades K5 and 1 who will be attending "Camp Fun for Kindergartners & First Graders" - Students should be picked up by the Shiocton Elementary School entrance at noon. The teachers will walk the students outside to you.
- All Other Students can be picked up at the District Main Entrance doorways ("Where Excellence Is Expected").
- For classes that end at noon, teachers will walk their students outside of the doorway, one class at a time, to meet you.
  - Please be aware of your child's last class. This will make it easy to located him/her as the classes come out.
- Please remember all social distancing guidelines during this time.
- Please remember that we do not have crossing guards for summer school.
