Mission Statement

What is PI-26?

PI-26 is the legislation that requires Academic and Career Planning to take place in all public schools in the State of Wisconsin. Each school district must provide evidence of their implementation of PI-26. The purpose of education for employment programs is to prepare all students for employment, to promote cooperation between business and industry and public schools, and to establish a role for public schools in the economic development of Wisconsin.

PI-26 Academic and Career Planning (ACP), is a student-driven, adult-supported process in which students create and cultivate their own unique and information-based visions for postsecondary success, obtained through self-exploration, career exploration, and the development of career management and planning skills. The Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (<http://dpi.wi.gov/acp>), in the PI-26 legislation, requires public school districts to provide academic and career planning services to students in Grades 6 - 12 beginning in the 2017-2018 school year. These academic and career planning requirements connect school districts' education for employment plans and programs to the new academic and career planning requirements. In the School District of Shiocton, we are proud to report that we have implemented Academic and Career Planning for numerous years utilizing Xello as our ACP online tool. The ACP is a 4-part process of KNOW, EXPLORE, PLAN, and GO, which students develop throughout middle school and high school. It is an integral part of our Comprehensive School Counseling conferencing model. The Shiocton School Counseling Program provides career development starting in elementary school, and also includes the Junior Achievement program. Then, in middle and high school, students build upon their knowledge and experiences to develop their ACP. The School District of Shiocton is committed to providing a solid foundation for all students to be successful in their chosen path after graduation.

Labor market information suggests that careers in health care, manufacturing, informational technology, and hospitality are the fastest growing career fields in our area. The School District of Shiocton provides students with the opportunity to participate in youth apprenticeships, work experiences, and dual credit options. As seniors, students participate in a mock interview with an employer within their career pathway. In addition, eighth grade students complete a job shadow within their career cluster.

Students are provided with information and guidance to make informed decisions regarding their educational and career path, whether their career goals are leading to an in-demand career area or a unique, narrow occupational area. Through the utilization of Xello, career exploration events, Youth Apprenticeship, and dual credit coursework the School District of Shiocton prepares students for life beyond high school in a variety of ways.

Communication With Parents Regarding Academic & Career Planning

The School District of Shiocton values the partnership with parents in educating students. This partnership is vital to the academic and career planning process. Therefore, multiple communication avenues will be utilized to best serve the needs of students.


Information about the academic and career planning process will be shared through the school website and monthly newsletter (*The Link*), as well as messages to families about events and activities. Chief Chats are held for students in Grades 5, 8, and 11 to share Academic Career Plans with family members. In addition, parent/teacher conferences are offered twice a year.



Engaging Community Stakeholders in Academic and Career Planning



A connection between K-12 education and community stakeholders is an asset to students, staff, employers, and our community. In Shiocton, the school is the heart of the community. We have forged many partnerships throughout our community to enhance students' academic and career planning. Some examples are Reality Check, classroom presentations, Junior Achievement, the Wolf River School to Work Wisconsin Youth Apprenticeship Program and CTE Business Partnerships, as well as student volunteer and employment opportunities. We look forward to continuing to expand our partnerships within the community.



Meeting the Needs of Individual Students in the Completion and Review of Academic and Career Plan Documents

Each student in Grades 6 - 12 in the School District of Shiocton is assigned to an advisor during Extended Learning Time (ELT). During ELT, students work through guided tasks in Xello, our online platform, to explore and house career information.

Shiocton High School provides many opportunities for students to earn college credit and experience advanced course offerings. Students may enroll in the AP classes of Computer Science, Calculus and Chemistry. CAPP courses are offered through UW-Oshkosh in Biology, History, and Physical Education. In addition, dual credit opportunities are available with agreements through Fox Valley Technical College and UW-Oshkosh, as well as through the Early College Credit and Start College Now Programs.
