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Route to Recovery Dollars: Sharing the Funds

Earlier this year, local municipalities were provided funds to assist in their efforts to support their communities through the pandemic and into an economic recovery. These "Routes to Recovery" grant dollars were provided so that the local municipalities could address some of the needs presented by the pandemic, most of which were unforeseen and therefore could not have been budgeted for. Where there were dollars remaining, the local municipalities were then able to share the funds with other local agencies, including school districts, or let the funds revert back to the State.

The School District of Shiocton wishes to extend our sincere gratitude to the Town of Black Creek, Town of Bovina, Town of

Center, and Town of Deer Creek for sharing their remaining Routes to Recovery grant dollars. Together, these funds totaled just over \$20,000. The money was used to offset the many disinfecting and sanitizing costs the District has incurred due to the pandemic, as well as costs related to face coverings, face shields, plexiglass dividers, and other resources needed to keep staff and students healthy and safe while schooling in-person.

Too, the School District wishes to thank the Village of Shiocton and the other townships who expressed a willingness to share remaining funds had there been any. We are thankful for all of the support.

Together, we will remain healthy and safe while working and learning in-person.

Happy December, everyone! I again want to thank our entire community for “stepping it up a notch” to keep our school healthy, safe, and open. It takes extra effort on the behalf of everyone to keep everything going and all of us at the Shiocton School District appreciate all the precautions everyone is taking. Thank you for being kind and understanding with everything going on.

The most important thing that you can do is to keep your child home if they are sick. The presentation of COVID-19 in children has been very similar to that of a “common cold”. If your child has a cough, runny nose, sore throat, headache, or loss of taste or smell they should be staying home. Please reach out to myself, Mrs. Sell, or Mrs. Dembowski if your child is staying home for these reasons. A coronavirus test may be required prior to your child returning to school.

Also, a reminder to get your flu vaccinations as soon as possible. This year is more important than ever to get one as there is very little research done on caring for individuals who may simultaneously get influenza along with COVID-19. Getting a flu vaccination is very easy. Your primary care physician can set you up with one or many local pharmacies that have walk-in vaccinations as well.

School delays will typically be for a two-hour time period and will also cause a cancellation of the morning Early Childhood program. Should school be canceled for the day or early in the afternoon, all extra-curricular events and practices will also be canceled. Announcements will be posted to television and radio stations, including their online listings, as early as possible.

Doing so will ensure that you receive these important email, phone calls, and text messages.

TITLE IX (SEXUAL HARASSMENT CHANGES)

The School District of Shiocton is reaching out to inform our stakeholders about changes that were made to federal Title IX guidelines as it pertains to our policies and procedures related to sexual harassment. Please read through the following updates, particularly the changes that were made to the personnel involved in Title IX reporting.

Title IX Nondiscrimination Policy Statement:

As mandated by the current provisions of Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 and under the regulations set forth in Chapter 106 of Title 34 of the Code of Federal Regulations ("the federal Title IX regulations"), the District does not unlawfully discriminate on the basis of sex in any education program or activity that the District operates. Title IX's requirement not to discriminate in any educational program or activity extends to cover, but is not limited to, District students, certain admissions processes, and District employment. Inquiries regarding how Title IX and the federal Title IX regulations apply to the District may be referred to a District Title IX Coordinator (as designated below), to the Assistant Secretary for Civil Rights at the U.S. Department of Education, or to both.

The District's commitment to nondiscrimination under Title IX and under other state and federal laws is further defined in the following policies of the School Board: Policy 0145-Sexual and Other Forms of Harassment; Policy 1662-Employee Anti-Harassment; Policy 2266-Nondiscrimination on the Basis of Sex in Education Programs or Activities; Policy 3210-Staff Ethics; and Policy 5517-Student Anti-Harassment, as published on our District's website.
