# PK-6 Information for the 2019-2020 School



Arrival to School: STUDENTS WHO WALK TO SCHOOL OR ARE DROPPED OFF AT SCHOOL SHOULD NOT ARRIVE BEFORE 7:40 a.m. (The only exception would be for students coming for breakfast from 7:30-8:00 a.m. in the cafeteria.). We ask for your cooperation with this since supervisors are not on duty until this time and teachers are making final preparations for the day within their classrooms. If the crossing guard is not yet outside by the elementary doorway that means it is too early to arrive at school. We ask

that you do not drop your child off until the crossing guard is in place. Once the crossing guard is in place, the buses begin unloading students. At this time, elementary students report to the hallway area behind the office. Middle school students report to the lobby area by the cafeteria.

3:00 p.m. - K4 & K5 Dismissal 3:00-3:02 p.m. - Grade 1 Dismissal





<u>Free & Reduced Hot Lunch/Breakfast Program</u>: If you believe you may be eligible for the free lunch/breakfast program or the reduced lunch/breakfast program, please complete and return the application form to the District Office before school begins (even if you are not sure as to whether or not you qualify). All applications are confidential and are reviewed in accordance with state guidelines for the Free and Reduced Lunch/Breakfast program. **Until the applications have been approved, students must pay regular prices.**Therefore, please submit your application form as soon as possible. If you need an application form or have any questions about completing the form, please contact the Business Office at 986-3351 ext. 716.

<u>Medication</u>: Please remember that students are <u>not</u> permitted to bring medication to school. <u>Medication must be brought to the school nurse by a parent/guardian</u>. If you have any questions, please contact the school nurse, Rebecca Ecker, at 986-3351 ext. 714.



<u>Open House for Elementary & Middle School</u>: Families have the opportunity to come in and drop off supplies in the appropriate classrooms prior to the first day of school. <u>The Open House will take place on Wednesday, August 28<sup>th</sup> from 4:00-6:00 p.m.</u>



<u>Elementary Open House</u> – 4:00-6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, August 28<sup>th</sup> \*Come in, drop off materials & supplies, & see your new classroom.

<u>Middle School Open House</u> – 4:00-6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, August 28<sup>th</sup> \*Come in, drop off materials/supplies, receive your locker information, & receive your schedule. \*<u>For Grade 6 – There will be a meeting at 5:30 p.m.</u> on this day in the cafeteria.



#### **Picture Day:** Picture Day is scheduled for **Thursday**, **September 12<sup>th</sup>**.

(Parents/guardians of K4 T/TH students, may bring their children in on September 12<sup>th</sup> or have their child's picture taken on the retake day which will be a Monday or a Wednesday.)



**School Bus:** All students are expected to behave appropriately and safely while on the school bus. Even if your child is not a daily bus rider, he/she will likely ride the bus for various reasons (field trips, going to a friend's house, etc.). Here are the bus rules that you can discuss with your child/children:



Use quiet voices. Use kind words. Report unsafe activity to the driver. Follow all directions from the driver.

Stay in your seat. Pick up litter that you see. Face forward at all times. Keep hands, feet and objects to yourself.

**School Expectations:** Each and every day at the PK-6<sup>th</sup> grade level, we work very hard to reinforce the following expectations with the students:



Be safe. Be respectful. Be responsible. Be the BEST that you can be!



These expectations are posted within the classrooms and are included in the daily announcements. Please discuss these expectations with your child at home prior to him/her coming to school.

**School Newsletter:** The Link is the school newsletter which is available online each month. Please visit the school website at www.shiocton.k12.wi.us and click on "The Link" tab on the left to view the most current school newsletter. This newsletter contains information for the entire district. Within this newsletter, you will discover information about the things going on at school, a calendar of school activities and events, the lunch menu for the upcoming month, and so much more. **School Website**: Make sure to check the Shiocton School District website (www.shiocton.k12.wi.us) frequently for the most up-to-date information. On the website, you can view the lunch menu, get information on athletic events, access *The Link* (school newsletter) and much, much more. For elementary information, click on "Schools" and then "EL Home" to get to the elementary homepage. Shiocton Partners in Children's Education (SPICE): SPICE is the school's Parent/Teacher Organization (PTO). This committee of volunteers meets on a monthly basis to plan special events and activities for the students and families within the Shiocton School District. Parents, community members, and staff members are always welcome to attend! SPICE is always looking for more people to become involved in order to continue to operate and do all of the wonderful things that they do. **Student Dress:** Parents are encouraged to see that students are dressed in a manner which is appropriate for school. The attitudes of students are often affected by the way they are dressed. Jackets, coats, hats, headbands, short shorts, spaghetti strap tank tops, etc., are not allowed in



school, as well as clothing that is excessively torn or full of holes. Clothing promoting alcohol, tobacco, or drugs is not permitted. Clothing containing inappropriate designs or words, suggestive, sexual, or gang related references is not to be worn in school. The school reserves the right to send students



home if their appearance does not reflect good taste, cleanliness, or is disruptive to the educational process. Your cooperation is <u>greatly</u> appreciated with this on a daily basis!

**Student Handbook Information**: The student handbook contains important information, rules, policies, etc. Please visit the district's website and click on "Registration Documents" on the left and then scroll down to "Handbooks" to see the student handbook. Please take time, prior to the beginning of the school year, to familiarize yourself with the handbook and to discuss the information with your child/children.

**Student Planners:** All students in grades 3-8 will receive a student planner (agenda) at the beginning of the

year. Elementary students are to record their assignments in their planners on a daily basis. The planners will serve as a major communication tool between home and school. Both teachers and parents will have opportunities to write messages in the planners on a daily and/or weekly basis. As students get older, we hope the use of the student planners in elementary school will have helped each individual with their overall organization and that the use of the planner becomes a habit. We believe the planners not only promote and enhance organizational skills, but also promote and enhance home/school communication. If



a student loses his/her planner, he/she will need to purchase another one for \$7.00 in the PK-6 school office.
