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GRADUATION 2020 to be held June 27

The School District of Shiocton is pleased to announce that the Shiocton Airport and the Shiocton Flyers Club have generously donated the use of their facility and land so that an in-person graduation ceremony can be held on Saturday, June 27.

"The District is sincerely appreciative of the Flyer's Club's partnership to afford this year's graduates an opportunity to experience an in-person, more traditional graduation ceremony, "said Mrs. Schweitzer, District Administrator.

In a his communication to senior students, Mr. Ortlieb commented, "I have some great news. We will be able to hold an in-person graduation ceremony for you. It will be held on June 27th at 1 PM at the Shiocton Airport.

While details will be forth coming to seniors and their parents over the next few weeks, the major plans to hold the event at the airport are solidly in place per Mrs. Schweitzer. "The open-aired venue and large grounds will provide the necessary space for graduates and their six guest to implement common safety protocol such as social distancing of six feet. All attendees, including graduates, will be asked to wear a mask except when speaking or taking photos."

EVERYONE LOVES A PARADE

As this year has been quite unique for the seniors, the District is seeking to end their career as a student with a unique experience: a parade. The Shiocton-Bovina Fire Department along with the Shiocton Police Department and Outagamie County Sheriffs Department will lead and end the parade of graduates following the commencement ceremony. "The parade will proceed from the Airport down Hwy 54, turning left on Second Street to Rail Road, and then up N Broad Street to Hwy 54." Residents are encouraged to observe social distancing when watching the graduates on the parade route. It is anticipated that the parade will begin around 2PM.

"An often used proverb in education, it applies wholeheartedly to this year's graduation events. The in-person graduation ceremony would not be possible without the helping hands of so many in our village. We are so thankful to everyone," said Mrs. Schweitzer.









CHIEF CHATTER SUMMER SCHOOL, FALL RETURN

S o much remains up in the air with regard to our ability to see the students returning to the building in August for summer school and in September for the start of the new school year. A few scenarios have been shared among school district administrators and others have been suggested by those in the health care industry, all of which bring with them varying degrees of return and a great deal of continued uncertainty.

Two things that are for certain are: (1) The District's commitment to providing a quality education for all students while (2) ensuring the safety and health of our learners and educators.

PROTOCOLS ARE HERE TO STAY

I believe it is safe to say that the health and safety protocols we have implemented over the past few months are very likely to remain well into the next school year. We will seek ways to incorporate social distancing while providing instruction for all of our learners. Wearing a mask, washing hands/using hand sanitizer often, and wiping down surfaces before and after use are a few of the additional protocols that are likely to remain as we seek to bring students back together for on-campus instruction.

Making accommodations and modifications for those with health concerns or whom are considered medically fragile are also aspects of instruction that we will have to take into consideration come fall.

LET'S ALL DO OUR PART

In a recent data analysis, ThedaCare shared that persons were 75% less likely to contract the coronavirus if they partnered social distancing with wearing a mask. Parents, please begin to help your child recognize personal space, even if it is not the full six feet. Too, please help your child begin to learn to wear a mask. Both will be very helpful when the new school year begins.

Prom postponed to Winter 2020

The continued concerns regarding the spread of the coronavirus led school administration to more closely examine the feasibility of providing an authentic Prom experience to the high school students. Following discussion with class advisors and parents, as well as consideration regarding researched various options, the District has made the decision to postpone Prom 2020 until next school year. "While we tried our best to create opportunities, even trying to wait out COVID-19, we find that we just cannot hold the prom that we want our students to have while successfully implementing the many safety and health recommendations, including social distancing, set forth by various health organizations. The School District also cannot promote gatherings of students that require close proximity during a pandemic of this nature," commented Mr. Ortileb, MS/HS Principal.

The plan is to reschedule Prom for sometime this coming winter. This will give the students a third opportunity to socialize outside of the class setting next year. It will also mean that the hard work of planning the event will bear fruit in the end. Watch for more details in the coming months.

IMMUNIZATION REMINDER



The following are the immunization requirements for the **2020-2021** school year for your child. Unless a waiver has been signed, all students are required to have their immunizations up to date on the **first day of the new school year**. Students **entering 6th grade** will need to receive a Tdap vaccine. Students **entering K5** will need to have a series of vaccines to be compliant with immunization law. Please provide the school with a copy of any new immunizations your child has received. Plan ahead and have your child immunized prior to the beginning of the school year.
