

**Skyward FAQs**

**What do I do if I forgot my password?**

If the school has an email address on file for you, you can click the **Forgot your Login/Password** link from the main Skyward screen. You will be prompted to enter your username or email and then click the **submit** button. You will then be sent a new password to your email account.

If the school does not have an email address on file for you, you will need to contact your school office to receive your new password.

**What do I do if I did not receive a username/password?**

You will need to contact your school office to receive this information.

**How do I view my student's grades?**

To see your student's grades from Skyward, first log in and then on the left, click the link titled **Gradebook**.

**How do I view my student's schedule?**

To see your student's schedule from Skyward, first log in and click the **Family Access** link, then on the left click the link titled **Schedule**. This will show you the period of the day the course meets, the class ID and sections, the course name, term, days of the week the class meets, the teacher of the course, and the number of credits for the course.

If you have questions about the schedule for your student, please contact your student's school.

**How do I check attendance for my student?**

To see attendance for you student, log in to Skyward, click

the **Family Access** link then click the link titled **Attendance**. There are three views in the Attendance area: 1) Calendar, 2) By Day, and 3) Term Totals.

- 1) The **Calendar** view will show you a monthly calendar and if your student was not in school, the absence will be noted on the calendar by a color on the date of the absence.
- 2) The **By Day** view will list each day the student was absent from school, the type of absence, and the reason for the absence.
- 3) The **Term Totals** view will give a total number of each type of absence broken down by the terms of the school year.

If you have questions about the attendance for your student, please contact your student's school.

**What is the Message Center?**

The **Message Center** is an area where teachers can post messages to the parents/guardians of the students in their class. To see any messages that have been posted from your student's teacher(s), click on the **Message Center** link after logging in to **Family Access** in Skyward. If there is a new message, there will be a link to view the message next to the teacher/class who posted the message. Click the **"View Messages"** link to see the message. This link will stay active until the teacher removes it.



**Tri- County Community Dental Clinic  
is coming to  
Shiocton Elementary School**



On Tuesday, November 14, the Tri-County Dental Clinic will come to Shiocton Elementary school to offer a free dental screening and fluoride varnish to qualifying students. The qualification for

participation in this program is that the student receives free or reduced cost hot lunch, and does NOT have private dental insurance. It is available for students in preschool, kindergarten, and elementary school.

This largely volunteer-driven nonprofit clinic focuses on prevention and early intervention with youngsters who have limited access or whose families cannot afford dental care. The first phase of this program takes place at school with subsequent treatment either at school or at Tri-County Community Dental Clinic. All services are offered free of charge including dental cleaning and any restorative treatment a child may require.

**Reminder from the Health Office**



With the cold and flu season upon us it is important to remember a few things:

1. When your child has a fever, he/she cannot attend school. A child with a temperature over 100 degrees should not be sent to school. Please do not allow your child to return to school until free of a fever for 24 hours. Giving medication such as Tylenol, may temporarily reduce the fever, but will not reduce the risk of passing the infection on to other people.

2. A child with vomiting and/or diarrhea should be kept home for at least 24 hours after the last episode to allow the body time to recuperate. Call your doctor if prompt improvement does not occur.

3. A child with a deep or hacking like cough belongs at home. If your child has coughing that is accompanied by a high fever or wheezing, you should consult their doctor immediately.

4. A rash may be the first sign of many illnesses. Do not send your child to school with a widespread rash. Again, consult your doctor before you send the child.

5. A child with a mild cold or sore throat with no other symptoms may go to school. They should

be encouraged as always to practice good hand washing.

6. It is important that your child's emergency information is up to date. If you or your emergency contacts have any address or home/cell/work phone number changes, please update that information with the office as soon as possible.

7. If your child does get sick at school, then you will need to have someone available to pickup him/her immediately. We need to keep other students and staff healthy and safe.

8. If your child should require medication during the school day, remember the school supplies no medication. Medication must be brought in by an adult in the original labeled container along with a permission form from either parent.






## Veterans Day Breakfast
